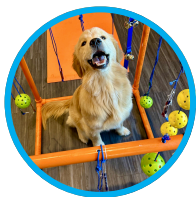




## BARK U Training Guide: The Importance of Enrichment Toys

- **Training Opportunities:** Food puzzles can reinforce positive behaviors like patience and focus.

## How to Get Started with Enrichment

- 1. Introduce Gradually:** Start with easy toys like stuffed KONGs or slow feeders and gradually move to more challenging puzzles.
- 2. Rotate Toys:** Keep things exciting by rotating toys weekly to maintain your dog's interest.
- 3. Combine Feeding with Play:** Instead of a bowl, serve meals using toys like snuffle mats or treat dispensers.
- 4. Supervise Play:** Especially when introducing new toys, ensure they're safe and appropriate for your dog's size and chewing habits.

## Tips for Success

- Use high-value treats or part of your dog's daily kibble as a reward inside the toys.
- Keep enrichment sessions short and fun—5–10 minutes can make a big difference!
- Be patient! It may take a few tries for your dog to understand how to use a new toy.

**Examples:** Outward Hound Fun Feeder, LickiMat

### Snuffle Mats

- Allow your dog to engage in their natural foraging instincts while searching for kibble or treats.

### Interactive Toys

- Provide physical exercise and mental stimulation through interactive play.

**Examples:** Flirt Poles, Tug Toys
